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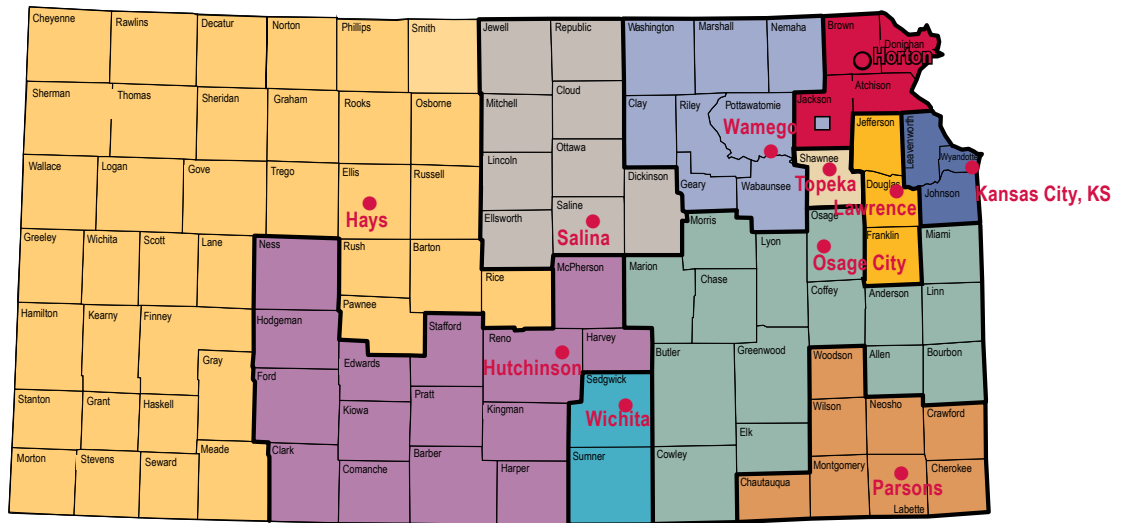

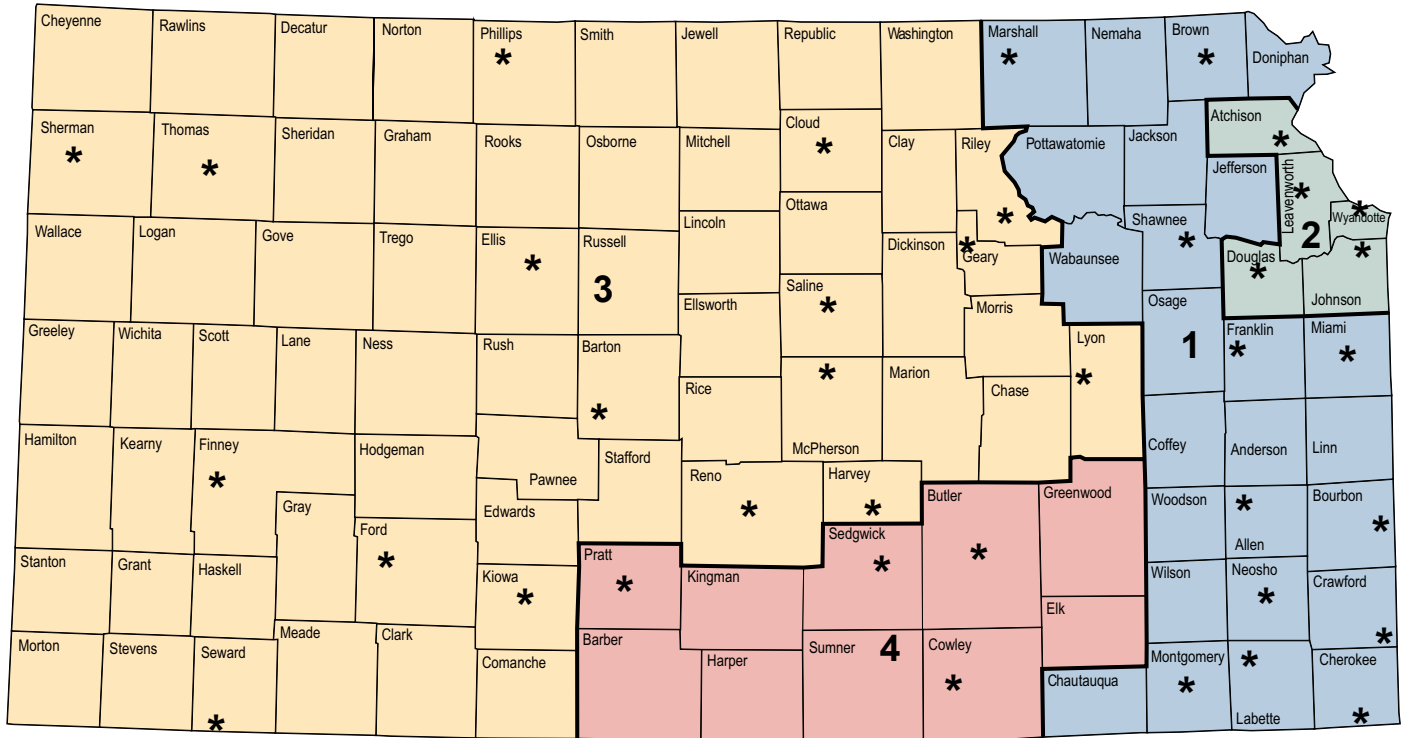

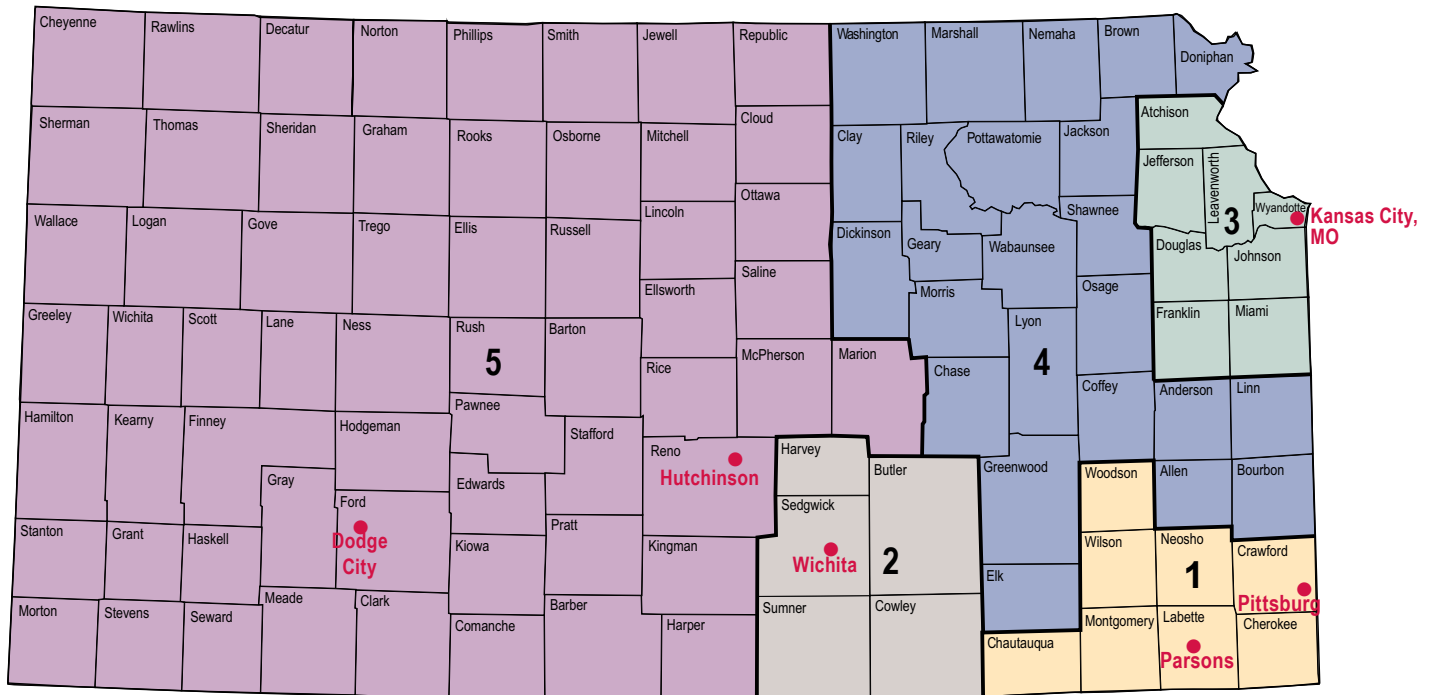

Services for people who are blind or visually impaired are provided through a contact from the Vocational Rehabilitation Services to three groups: Alphapointe Association for the Blind, Kansas City; Envision Vision Rehabilitation Center, Wichita and a consortium of independent living centers headed by Prairie Independent Living Resource Center, Hutchinson. These groups provide services to support independent living and employment. These groups increase capacity in specialized areas such as orientation and mobility, rehabilitation teaching, independent living skills training, Braille instruction and assistive technology.

Money Follows the Person (MFP) is a joint federal-state program partnership grant. Its purpose is to help individuals currently living in institution settings to choose to transition into community base services. Individuals must reside in a nursing facility (INP) or an ICF/MR (private or state hospital) for individuals with developmental disabilities. Individuals must qualify for medicaid; and for one or the following four(4) Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) waiver programs: Frail Elder Waiver (FE), Physical Disabilities waiver (PD), Intellectual/Developmental Disability waiver (I/DD), or Traumatic Brain injury waiver (TB).

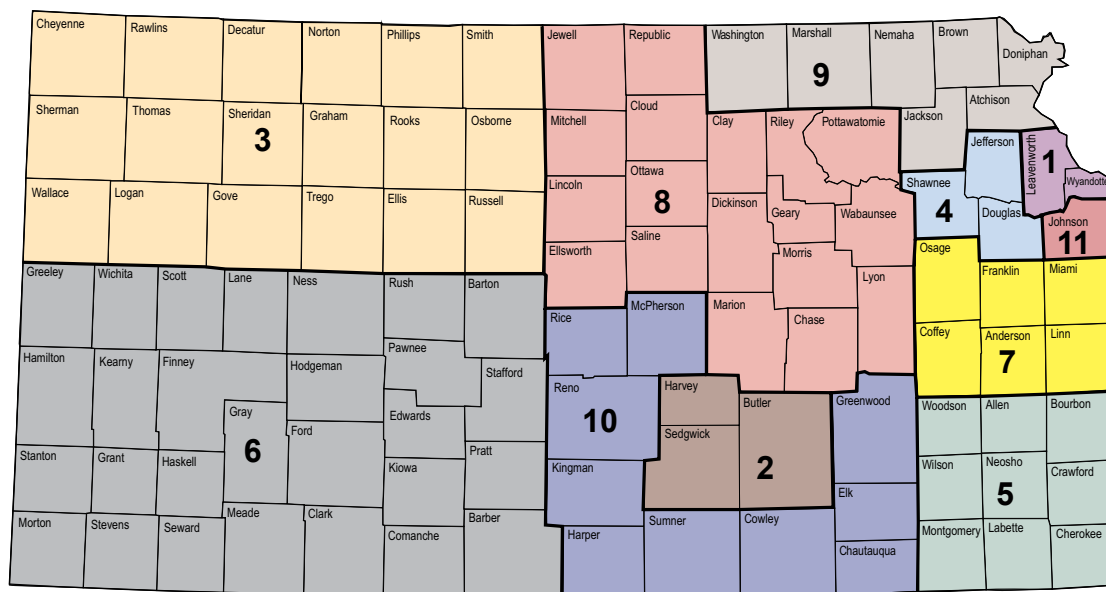

The Kansas Department of Commerce, with grant funding from the U.S. Department of Labor, Veterans Employment and Training Service, offers employment and training services to eligible veterans. For assistance, contact one of these local workforce centers and talk with the Local Veterans Employment Representative (LVER). The LVER is an employment specialist who has a large reservoir of information about jobs and education/training opportunities, veterans' rights and benefits, laws affecting veterans, employment trends and all services available through the workforce center. The LVER also has information about other services available through other agencies, including veterans' organizations. Disabled Veteran Outreach Program Specialists (DVOPs) are also available in some locations.
